

Growing Power Demand= Big Summer Projects

With more customers turning to electric vehicles to get around town and heat pumps to heat and cool their homes, we see power demand increases across our service area. To meet that growing demand, we are bolstering the grid through impactful projects this summer.

Jennings Park Substation: To increase capacity in Marysville, crews are constructing a new larger substation near Jennings Park and building new high-voltage lines to serve it.

Camano Substation: After building a second transmission line to Camano Island, crews are now rebuilding our Camano Substation to make power more reliable on the island with equipment that is more environmentally friendly.

Poplar Way relocation: Crews will be relocating transmission and distribution lines near Alderwood Mall to make room for a future I-5 overpass.

Millwright Loop project: To help support the Port of Everett's Millwright Loop redevelopment project along the waterfront, crews will work this summer to complete a build-out of our distribution system.
