# STATE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

#### Date of Issuance:

March 20th, 2025

## Name of Proposal:

Hat Island Electric Cable Replacement

## **Description of Proposal:**

Public Utility District No. 1 of Snohomish County (PUD) is proposing to install a new three-phase electric submarine cable between Hat Island in Possession Sound, and the Port of Everett to continue reliable electric service to PUD customers on Hat Island. The new cable will replace the existing cable that was installed in 1974, which is reaching the end of its serviceable life. The cable will be installed using horizontal directional drilling (HDD) at both landfalls to avoid sensitive shoreline areas. The cable will emerge underwater and be laid directly on the seafloor between the drilled areas for a total distance of approximately six miles. The work is expected to begin in phases during summer 2025 and be completed by mid-2026.

Public Utility District No. 1 of Snohomish County

#### Location of Proposal, including address, if any:

Project components are located at the Port of Everett, Hat Island, and within the Possession Sound. An attached site map shows the location of the project, including the in-water routing of the submarine cable.

The Port of Everett is accessed by the west end of Hewitt Ave, Bond Street and Terminal Ave and the Hat Island boat launch.

#### **Threshold Determination:**

The PUD, the lead agency for this proposal, has evaluated this proposal and determined that it will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment.
